

The Gallup Organization in collaboration with Princeton University had developed the instrument. The Blaise instrument was developed in association with Census Bureau and all coding of activities in the Diary, and Occupation was handled by TecTrak Inc. The 3 digit industry coding was done by The Gallup Organization.
